Walking With Christ

"Using GPS"

Navigating through life is a challenge. In our formative years, we are guided by a Parental Guidance System (PGS). This PGS nourishes our innocent lives, directs our steps and actions, blocks our path when we try to go the wrong way, and prepares us for our life's journey. Even when we leave the PGS, we are still guided by it through the experience and direction it instilled in us. Then as we leave home, go to college, get a job, get married, and have a family, we have a foundation that helps us navigate through life.

In our Christian lives, we are guided by a different navigation system. It is God's Positioning System (GPS). Using GPS is what we are doing when we are Walking with Christ. Peter tells us that Jesus left us an example of how to navigate through our Christian life by following in his steps (1 Pet. 2:21). He provides us direction for our spiritual life showing us how to remain faithful as we navigate the obstacles Satan throws in our way. As Solomon tells us, "A man's mind plans his way, but the Lord directs his steps" (Prov. 16:9). God desires that each one of us reach our destination in life - our eternal home with him (2 Pet. 3:9). Using GPS allows God to direct our steps and actions, to block our pathway when we try to go the wrong way, and to guide us gently home. The psalmist testifies to this when he writes, "You hem me in behind and before, and you lay your hand upon me" (Ps. 139:5). We put ourselves in great danger if we are not using GPS. "Where there is no guidance, a nation falls, but in an abundance of counselors there is safety" (Prov. 11:14). So as we navigate through life, let us "Commit our way to the Lord so he can act" (Ps. 37:5) by guiding us into his glorious presence. For heaven's sake, do not ignore Using GPS!
