Sermon Scripture: James 3:1-12

Sermon Thought: Controlling the tongue is important because there is so much power wrapped up in such a small muscle. James uses three illustrations to demonstrate this power, a bit in a horses' mouth, a ships rudder, and a flame that sets a forest on fire. He said in 1:26 that we should bridle our tongues, yet in 3:8 he paradoxically says, "no human being can tame the tongue."

Sermon Questions:

- 1. Why is the tongue so difficult to control?
- 2. How might James instruct his readers today about the tongue and today's technology (e.g. email, blogs, facebook, etc.)?
- 3. Take time and discuss some guidelines to help us have speech that glorifies God.

"What Really Matters?"

One man put it this way when he suddenly found himself on a hospital bed: "I came to realize I no longer really cared for what the world chases after, such as how much money you have in the bank and how many cars are parked in the garage. As it says in Ecclesiastes, chasing after these things is like chasing the wind, anyway. Suddenly, the rat race became vanity to me, utter vanity. I felt naked before God. If I died, I would take none of the stuff with me. All that really mattered ultimately was my relationship with the Lord, my relationship with family and friends. If it weren't for the loss of my health, I could have wasted the rest of my life chasing achievements and acquiring more transitory things."

This man learned a lesson that all of us need to learn: we need to learn to distinguish between those things that are temporary and those that are eternal. Paul writes: "For we brought nothing into this world and of a certainty we can carry nothing out" (1Timothy 6:7). Jesus said: "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal; but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matthew 6:19-21).

Finally, John writes, "The world and its desires pass away, but the man who does the will of God lives forever" (1 John 2:17). And so, at the end of the day, it is not the wealth, position or title we hold in life that matters, but how we use what He has placed temporarily in our hands. As we travel down the corridor of time toward eternity, are we wisely investing our lives in that which "really matters"? Dan Kent
