From July 22 to 29, we are starting a new church in Jordan, the capital town of Guimaras, Province. It's awesome to witness how God used the North Garland church to have a connection in this church planting even though none of you are physically here to participate. The last time that we have had some of you was about 4 years ago when Jovita Lang, Sally Melvin, Terry Gordon, and Michael Manley came and helped us in Bato. And vet. I feel that you all are still very much involved. Just consider that we are still your missionaries and Tom, your former preacher and Julie his wife are literally leading and directing the church planting effort. We are riding the bus that was donated by an anonymous donor from North Garland. The church planting project itself was conceptualized at North Garland 21 years ago during the Philippine Mission forum that you all hosted. We started the vision right there and God has used it to inspire more folks. So many have caught the fire! We have identified 44 capital cities without a church 21 years ago and now it's down to 3 after Jordan. We stuck to the vision of going to each and every capital city without the Church of the Lord. Maybe some of you will be receiving pictures and images on Facebook about Jordan. Thank you so much for all the support and prayers that you all fervently offer for our behalf.
