Tight Rings

Do you love trees? Yes, me too. Growing up in this part of Oklahoma, we really appreciate them. There are very few native trees in this part of the state. Most pictures of the early settlers show no trees at all. So, if you found a tree it was very special. Some of my relative's land abstracts even included certain trees in them.

I recently heard of a couple who wanted to build their dream home in northern California. They bought this piece of property with a fabulous view. The only problem was a lone tree where they wanted to construct their new home. To solve this problem, they would use the wood from this tree to build their new home. So, they contacted a local saw mill to take the massive tree down. Problem solved.

Construction began on the new house. But, when it came time to use this tree wood for the build, the couple got a call from the local saw mill owner. "I'm sorry, that tree you wanted to use for your new house wasn't safe to use for construction." After he cut the tree down, the builder noticed the tree did not have tight rings, making the lumber too weak for construction. Apparently, the tree never went through any droughts or other stress in its life that would have given tight rings. (FYI, each ring of a tree equals a year of growing.)

We live in a culture that rewards everything. Everyone gets a trophy, fast food, drive through everything, shopping with just a few keyboard clicks. According to one of the latest polls, 86% of Americans believe in God but only 37% attend a local church. Some would say our church is suffering from the above, lack of attendance. Ears not being tickled enough with their own thoughts, so they go elsewhere or not at all. But what would Jesus say to all of this? John 14 is very comforting to me. Some of the highlights are: John 14:1, "Do not let your hearts be troubled, trust in God, trust also in me," John 14:9, "You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it," John 14:27, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."

Jesus says, "I got this, do not worry," twice in this short interaction with his disciples. Yes, I wish all times were great! But, as Christians we go through tough times and it builds our rings tight. We just have to go through each season of our life. Ecclesiastes 3:1-8, "There is a time for everything and a season for everything under heaven." If you were alive in 1967, there was a song by the Byrds called "Turn, turn, turn." Let's all get some tight rings this season!
