Hope for the Future

This time of year, there is a lot of hope going through people's minds. Hope for a certain something all wrapped up under the tree, that the mail service makes up for your procrastination by getting your package to its destination in time, or that 2019 is a better year. Still others hope for a job offer, freedom from addiction, safety in dangerous places, or the healthy birth of a child.

An interesting characteristic of hope is that it only arises out of desire; the desire for something better or desire for something needed. Think of it this way, if there were no hungry people, if there were no wars to cause fear, if every person had everything desired there would be no cause for hope. In the scriptures, the writer Paul puts it this way, *"hope that is seen is no hope at all. Who hopes for what they already have? But if we hope for what we do not yet have, we wait for it patiently."*

Living in a fallen world has times that are difficult, but a positive approach to cultivated is one of hope. Hope for a better future. I firmly believe that a life of faithfulness to God provides hope not only for future eternity, but also in for our future this life. Listen to what Paul wrote in Romans 5:5, *"we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we boast in the hope of the glory of God. Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us." The first few words there are important, "we have peace...." That peace comes from hope, not an unknown hope, but a hope that is eagerly anticipated. Because of that hope, we have peace during joblessness, homelessness, hunger; peace in the midst of sorrow, pain, and hurt.*

Take time this week to reflect upon these words of hope from David in Psalm 25, "In you, Lord my God, I put my trust. I trust in you... No one who hopes in you will ever be put to shame...show me your ways, Lord, teach me your paths. Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Savior, and my hope is in you all day long."
