Growing Spiritual Fruit

I recently had the opportunity to try a new kind of fruit, Dragon Fruit. If you have never seen it, it is about the size of a baked potato, has a red skin with orange flaps, and is white on the inside with small black seeds. It is interesting to look at, but as for taste, I found it to be bland.

God created all kinds of fruit to eat, some are better than others. Scripture commonly used the metaphor of fruit to talk about the contrast between good and evil people. Jesus' words recorded in Luke 6:43 say, "No good tree bears bad fruit, nor does a bad tree bear good fruit. Each tree is recognized by its own fruit...the good person brings good things out of the good stored up in his heart, and the evil person brings evil things out of the evil stored up in his heart." Also, in John 15:6, Jesus said that branches which don't bear fruit should be, "picked up, thrown into the fire and burned," John 15:6. No one wants bad fruit, it is only good to be tossed out.

I spoke at Hillsdale Christian School's chapel last week on this topic and during the talk, I tossed a rotten banana into the group of students. Most of them flinched and moved away because they didn't want to get it on them. There were a couple who thought it would be fun to grab the disgusting fruit. They had big smiles on their faces until they realized what they had done. Then their noses wrinkled up and looked for something to wipe their hands on.

Galatians chapter 5 lists what are commonly called, "the fruits of the Spirit." Those who follow God and allow his spirit to work in their lives will produce fruit like: patience, joy, peace, gentleness and self-control. However, Galatians also lists what I call, "fruits of the flesh." The fruits of the flesh include things like: hatred, jealousy, anger, and drunkenness. No one wants to be around people who are full of fruits of the flesh, so they move away just like the students moving away from the rotten banana.

Take time this week to examine the kind of spiritual fruit you are producing in your life. Consider other's reactions to you. Do people around you get filled with joy or frustration? Distrust or openness? People tend to move away from bad fruit and towards the good fruit. The way to get to bearing good fruit in your life, is to spend time with Jesus who said, *"I am the vine; you are he branches. If a person remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit...,"* John 15:5.
