"Before there was Time"

One of my favorite movies over the years is "Back to the Future." Being able to go back in time is an intriguing thought. I would dearly love to walk back through some of my childhood memories from where I am today. To watch a little boy as he moves through the crowded streets darting in and out of the stores of my home town on Saturday night.
