Sermon Scripture: Daniel 2

"Touched by the Master's Hand"



It was a neat feeling when I was greeted by Dick Chaney, the former Vice President of the United States when I was working in the Pentagon. My thoughts and emotions ran wild as I stood by a lighthouse in Thessaloniki, Greece where the apostle Paul probably stood during his missionary journey there.
