Sermon Scripture: Psalm 13

Sermon Thought: We have an expression, "Light at the end of the tunnel," meaning things aren't so great right now, but I can tell that it will end soon. Those times of darkness in life can be difficult to work through. King David had those times and often wrote psalms during those moments. In Psalm 13, David spends the first 4 verses talking about lost he is, but the last 2 verses serve as a reminder that there is light at the end.

God the Tree Pruner

I greatly enjoy Spring time. The weather gets warm. Flowers and trees begin to sprout. Grass turns green again. All that being said though, Spring also brings LOTS of yard work: have to get rid of dead branches that fell during the winter storms, time to prune trees, and weeds...oh, the weeds. It is no wonder Jesus often used parables about working outside to get his messages across. There are so many good lessons to learn. One of my favorite parables comes from John 15, in which Jesus says, "I am the true vine; you are the branches...If you remain in me...."

A few years ago, I went to look at buying some fruit trees and came across an apple tree that was made from ten different apple trees. The roots from one had the trunk from another grafted into them. Then eight branches had been grafted into the trunk, each bearing a different kind of apple. I found it amazing (especially since I can hardly keep anything alive). Here was a single tree but was a spectacular mixture of so many different varieties.

That apple tree serves as a reminder about the beauty of God's kingdom. Jesus is the source of life, God is the gardener. The gardener grafts people in. People of all different backgrounds to make something marvelous. Revelation 7:9-10 says, "There before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne...they cried out in a loud voice: 'Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the lamb!"

God is building a marvelous kingdom of diversity for us to be a part of. However, Jesus' parable also came with a warning saying God, "cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit." Let this parable be a reminder to us the spring, as we see new plants blooming, to be people who bear godly fruit in our lives.
