

# "I can do all Things"

The children's nursery story "The Little Engine that Could" has a powerful message for us to live by. It has to do with a little steam engine that was asked to tow a train up a mountain and down. That seemed like an impossible task for the small engine, but with the aid of a confident thought process – "I think I can, I think I can" – the little guy was able to accomplish the task. Such is life for us when we set in our minds that we can do the things that need to be done. We must believe in ourselves and the one who created us.

Doing the Lord's work can be a daunting task, and it even seems impossible at times. It is easy to believe we can't do something – it is too hard – we do not have the needed experience - or it is some task we are not interested in. Jesus gives us some much needed assurance that we can conquer any mountain just as the little steam engine did. He tells us to "Have faith in God. Truly, I say to you, whoever says to this mountain, 'Be taken up and cast into the sea, and does not doubt in his heart, but believes that what he says will come to pass, it will be done for him" (Mk. 11:22-24). Are we willing to give ourselves fully to the Lord so he can carry out his divine will through us? Are we intent on completing our spiritual journey toward our home in heaven? If Jesus could leave the glory of heaven and take on human form so he could conquer the greatest obstacle to mankind - sin, then we have the divine power to also do the impossible. As Paul boldly announces, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me" (Phil. 4:13).
