

As I look around our society today, I often see an absence of patience. Honestly, I feel it within myself too. Yes, there is a lot that we need to get done, and the sooner the better according to most. But it seems as though too many are putting themselves at danger physically, mentally, and even spiritually because we have not practiced patience. So, I want to encourage you this week to slow down.
