Part of the process of getting ready for the sale meant going through all the donations to organize them into like items. This was an interesting process and I found a few types of items sparked thoughts. The first, were brand new items. We're talking items still in their original wrapping with original price tags even. Why were these new items never used? Maybe they were gifts given but not useful. Perhaps they were the wrong item purchased and didn't get returned. They may have just gotten lost at the back of the closet. The second group I found odd were items that, how shall I say this...were well past being useful. These items were being held together by tape, had missing parts, or were just no longer useful in today's world. I admit, there were many things I had no idea what they were (but I had fun trying to figure it out).

People are notorious for holding on to "stuff" not needed. Sure, it may be useful "someday," and there are always sentimental reasons for tucking things in the attic. But generally, most of us are holding tightly to junk we don't need.
