Sermon Scripture: Exodus 15-40

Sermon Thought: Today's sermon revolved around the topic of the Mosaic Law, laws given by God to help his people learn what it meant to be "holy" or set apart from the nations around them. Keeping the law is not what makes a person good or bad. Keeping the law is a way of living different, a way of living for something beyond yourself. It is surrender or as we looked at last week, bondage without chains. Now keep in mind, the Mosaic Law is very different from the law of righteousness. The first leads only to death, the second to life.

Sermon Questions:

1. Take some time and share about man-made laws you have broken. Which have you felt bad about the most?

2. What do you think is the primary purpose behind man-made laws?

3. Which law (Mosaic type laws like the 10 commandments or law of righteousness) do you think is most difficult to keep and why? Keep in mind Jesus' elaboration of the 10 commandments.

My mom's brother, Ernest Dirks, was in the infantry during WWII and served in Germany. In one of the German villages his combat unit went through, they came upon a German dog. The GIs were trying to get the dog to come to them, but it wouldn't respond. Then Ernie shouted *"kommin sie das hund"* and the dog immediately came to him. You see, the dog didn't understand English. There are times in our lives we don't respond to the requests, commands or instructions we are given because we don't understand. When this happens, we have to decide if we are going to make an effort to understand or just to ignore it. How we respond can have a tremendous impact on our lives.

We have one that was sent by God who calls us to "**come to me**." Do we hear his voice? How do we respond? Jesus tells us "*and I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself*" (Jn. 12:32). This Jesus is the Son of God – he is the King of Kings – and the Lord of Lords. He knows the way to eternal life with our heavenly Father. He opened that pathway by giving his life as a ransom for our sins on the cross. To hear his voice calling us to **come to me** is inspiring and life changing. It is comforting to know that he calls us through all languages. We don't have to know German to know what he is saying. Here is what Jesus has to offer us. "*Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls*" (Matt. 11:28-29). He gives us rest for our souls, how precious! O how we need rest from the weariness of life and the challenges we face each day. Praise God that Christ **called us to him** so we can be with him in heaven. Listen for his voice saying "**come to me**" and go to him without haste.
