Corrected Our Behavior

"A Spiritual Example"

If you are like me, the thing I detested most about childhood is when my parents **corrected my behavior**. First of all, I never did anything wrong, in my mind. Secondly, the discipline hurt and was humiliating. But most of all, I learned from the experience and tried my best not to do the same things again. Why did my parents do that to me? Because they loved me and wanted me to have a good life. I probably didn't grasp the full value of this until I became a parent and had to correct our children's behavior.

As we begin our spiritual journey with Christ, we again have a lot to learn. We often make mistakes and do things wrong, even though we don't think we are. When we do, our heavenly Father puts a spiritually mature brother or sister in our pathway to **correct our behavior**. Just as in my childhood, it hurts and humiliates us, but we learn from the experience. As the Hebrew writer notes, "My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor lose courage when you are punished by him. For the Lord disciplines him whom he loves and chastises every son whom he receives" (Heb. 10:5-6). Our heavenly Father sent his Son to earth to be a **spiritual example** for living a righteous life in the kingdom of God. "Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and being made perfect he became the source of eternal salvation to all who obey him" (Heb. 5:8-9). As we become a disciple of Jesus and follow in his steps, he guides us so we can remain faithful to the Lord's commands. Peter writes, "For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his steps" (1 Pet. 2:21). Christ our Lord is indeed a **spiritual example** for us in our journey toward our heavenly home. Take his hand and let him lead you!
