As a young boy, I was training to be a future rock climber. My training involved climbing up the outside of a silo on the ring connectors that went around the silo. My brother was my coach and my cousin was my trainer (meaning they were daring me to do it). One day when I was almost to the top, my father and uncle came to check on what we were doing. Now what do I do because my training to be a rock climber was far too dangerous, and I had now been caught? In spite of the discipline I received, I know my father **rescued me from disaster**.

Sometime in our journey through life, we fall prey to doing things that we shouldn't do and put our lives in jeopardy. Just like my brother and cousin, we too are encouraged by those we associate with to do things we know we shouldn't do. For the moment, we believe they are okay and that there is no harm involved. But the reality is, we are headed for disaster. We are so thankful that we have been **rescued from disaster** by our heavenly Father. As he looked down on his creation, he could see the eternal destiny of our lives caught in the dangers of sin. So he sent his Son to earth to **rescue us from disaster**. *“For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life”* (Jn. 3:16). Jesus came to get me down from that dangerous position on the silo by giving his life on the cross of Calvary. *“By his wounds we have been healed”* (1 Pet. 2:24). We must humble ourselves before the mighty hand of our loving Father, receive his mercy and grace, and be lifted up to our heavenly home with him. We have been **rescued from disaster** in the lake of fire with the devil and the false prophets (Rev. 20:10). *“Joy to the world, the Lord has come!”* and he has **rescued us from disaster**. I am so glad he came to check on me like my father did.
