Sermon Scripture: 1 Samuel 8-12

It's Always a Decision!

Sharing the Good News is always a decision! Not every time do I have the great desire or passion to do it, but I still do it. I know it is the right thing to do. Perhaps it is just like going to school to learn Algebra or Geometry, or working a job I need, but don't like 100%. I have to push on, go to school or my job, because it is necessary.

The Lord in His parable, Matthew 13:31-32, "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and sowed in his field." Please note that the taking and the sowing is a deliberate decision. The life and growth is totally dependent on the sowers DECISION to get out to the field and sow the seeds! No matter how primitive or advanced the agricultural technology, the farmer has to make a DECISION to take the seeds out and sow them in the field.

We don't have to wait for the perfect condition or when we are in the best mood to plant the seeds. We just need to decide to go & "plant" the seed. God has promised to give the increase! In 1997, the decision was made from the Philippine Mission Forum that North Garland was hosting, and with the support of the elders & church, that we would partner together to take the Gospel to the 44 capital cities across the Philippines, which had no churches of Christ. We made a decision, we didn't know all the techniques we would use, we didn't know how we were going to fund all of it, but we knew we were called to go, and go now! Now, here we are in 2019, about to plant our 42nd church come the end of November, in the capital city of Tarlac province, sponsored by the Boerne Church of Christ, in Texas. With the help of North Garland, and many other churches in the states and in the Philippines, and the MOSES team, we have two more churches in capital cities to plant in 2020! Highland Lakes Church of Christ, in Kingsland, Texas has already agreed to help partner the last church planting in Basco, Batanes. Basco is so remote & travel will be the most expensive to get too, we are seeking another church to help partner with to help cover the funds needed for this church planting. Will you please be praying about that?

In our own circle of personal influences, we need to decide now to sow the precious seed to the hearts of folks around us. It is not always easy, but the result is always inspiring. The Psalmist said, "Those who sow in tears shall reap with shouts of joy. He who goes out weeping, carrying seed to sow, will return with songs of joy, carrying sheaves with him." Psalm 126:5-6. To our family at North Garland- thank you so much for being our partners & believers in our work of church planting in capital cities across the Philippines.
