Sermon Scripture: 1 Kings 12

**Sermon Thought**: Today's sermon looked at the nation of Israel splitting in two (Israel and Judah) due to the sins of its people. Sin's consequences are guaranteed in God's World, but the timing of those consequences is hard to predict. When we do something directly opposed to God's commands and there isn't immediate disaster, we are often fooled into believing we got away with disobedience. That is a dangerous assumption as the nation of Israel should help us see.

- 1. Have you ever done something wrong, thinking you got away with it, only to find out after that you were caught? Describe the roller coaster experience.
- 2. The Bible teaches that we "are not able to serve two masters." We are probably intellectually aware of this, yet why do we so often still try to do it?
- 3. What has stood out to you when you think over the last 4 sermons: Saul, David, Solomon, Divide?

## **Clothed Us in Righteousness**

#### "Garments of Skins"

Sometimes we don't appreciate what we have because we compare it to what someone else has. That was the case for the clothes I had to wear growing up. I always had good clean clothes, but my mother made the shirts I wore. My shirts were different from the store-bought shirts my friends wore, and I wanted to have what they had. I was thankful I had something to wear, but I wanted more. That is an unfortunate fact of life, no matter what we have achieved or have. There is always something else we want to be content.

This lack of appreciation for what we have can be traced back to the beginning of time. After God created Adam and Eve, the serpent enticed them to want something more or different. When God approached them, they felt ashamed because they were naked. It didn't matter before they were tempted, but when they stepped outside the limits of God instructions, their selfish desires were exposed. Then we read in Genesis 3:21 that "the Lord God made for Adam and for his wife garments of skins and clothed them." Just like my mother made sure my needs were met, so did God take care of Adam and Eve. And here is the good part, he still does that for us today. Just as Adam and Eve's sin exposed their nakedness, so does our sin expose our need to be clothed in righteousness. God takes care of our need to be clothed in righteousness. As Paul writes, "For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God" (2 Cor. 5:21). We too are then clothed in garments of skins – the skin of Jesus that was shed on the cross for our sins. When we are buried with Christ in baptism, we put on the garment of his pure and holy life (Gal. 3:27). As disciples of Christ, let us be proud of what we wear!
