In life, new experiences or new circumstances often carry either a sense of elation or a sense of uneasy tension- sometimes both. Take for instance the feeling being a parent of a recent high school graduate must bring. On one hand, they are excited and proud because their child has finished that last step into adulthood while also being fearful for them, because they, as experienced adults, have full knowledge of what difficulties being an adult can bring.

Jadey and I found ourselves in a similar situation recently as we embarked on a major life event. The days leading up to our move from Tennessee to Oklahoma were filled with the sweet air of eager anticipation in the new opportunity to serve God through the congregation at North Garland. Yet at the same time, a heavy presence of fear and melancholy plagued our move because of the obvious draw backs surrounding any move. For instance, we were moving away from my family and beloved friends, we worried about how we would fit in with the new congregation, and as any rookie ministry family would be, we were desperately hopeful for a church family that was loving, kind, and God-centered. What we found the day we arrived in Enid almost brought us to tears. A congregation of people we barely knew, had filled our house with food. Moreover, the following days were filled with people treating our family to meals, cars full of people coming by the house to check on us and help us move in, and on Sunday, we as a family were embraced by the congregation in the form of a meal and fellowship. The kind words, the hugs, the cards, and the God-loving members answered all our prayers. It was a powerful reminder that God takes care of His people.

In Luke 12:24 Christ says, "Consider the ravens: they neither sow nor reap, they have neither storehouse nor barn, and yet God feeds them. Of how much more value are you than the birds!" You see a life filled with service to God (in any of its forms) is a bonified 100% guarantee that God is going to take care of you and provide you with what you need. When you have fears or doubts about life or what its futures might bring, stop and *Consider the Ravens*.
