**Sermon Scripture**: 1 Samuel 7; Psalm 57

#### Refocus

Dr Martin Luther King once said, 'We must learn to live together as brothers or perish together as fools." We know he was referring to society as a whole, but this could easily be extended to Churches of Christ.

The current trends of churches in the United States is very sobering to say the least. Churches of Christ are the 13th largest religious group, but don't break the top 20 for growth. They have shrunk 930 members per month over the last 18 years. Fifty-five percent of Churches of Christ have an average attendance of 34 or less each Sunday and nine churches have dissolved each month over the last 3 years.

I don't want to come off as a negative Nancy, but we may need to refocus some of the things we do here at North Garland. Two key points experts recommend are:

- 1. A love focused on the young, unchurched, and diverse.
- 2. Clarity about our evangelistic strategy and developing of evangelistic skills.

What can our congregation do?

Several are listed by experts, but what I want to recommend are these:

- 1. Pray. Now is the time to trust God for our future.
- 2. Talk with, encourage, and focus on younger members.

My hope and prayer is that our church is doing these things that are recommended NOW. The pantry brings in a very diverse group to our building, so let's learn to talk and evangelize to this group! We have just experienced what the future can be like when His body works together to build a playground for the youth. What a great day last Sunday was. As one of the dads asked me Sunday, "What's next?"
