Completes Our Eternal Glory

"Holy and Pure"

Oh how I wished I could say that I was the perfect child growing up – that I never did anything wrong – that I was always obedient to my parents. Now mind you I came pretty close, but I still fell short – especially the time I told my dad to shut up! It has always puzzled me that we are so easily given to sin in our lives when we are created in God's image. God created us **holy and pure**, but we mess it up with the choices we make. He tells us to "be holy, for I am holy" (Lev. 11:44). How important is this to God? Important enough for him to send his Son to die for us! Therefore, in Christ we have the ability to "be perfect, as our heavenly Father is perfect" (Matt. 5:48). Yea! I can finally complete my childhood limitation for perfection.

When we give our lives to Christ, we are clothed in his holiness. "For in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ" (Gal. 3:26-27). You see, in Christ we stand before God holy and pure. The Hebrew writer gives us this assurance. "Let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water" (Heb. 10:22). Our sins are forgiven, and we are again made perfect, just as we were when he created us. We have now been set free from the law of sin and death (Rom. 8:2), but we must be careful not to use this freedom in the wrong way. As Paul reminds us, "For you have been called to freedom, brethren; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love be servants of one another" (Gal. 5:13). Keeping our spiritual eyes focused on Christ will guide us on our journey toward heaven. Let us savor the blessing of God's love that allows us to holy and pure – just as he is.
