Dealing with the Dirt

Everyone cleans from time to time. It may be items like toys, dishes, desks, or laundry. There is even virtual cleaning that must sometimes be done like on a computer desktop! One thing that everyone has to occasionally deal with is dirt. Dirt gets everywhere... vehicles, clothes, carpet, hands and so on. Think of all the steps people take to deal with dirt. There are door mats to wipe shoes, vacuums for carpet, filters to clean the air, sinks with soap to keep hands clean, washing machines to get dirt off clothes, and water filters to keep water clean. We are dealing with dirt all the time to stay clean.

We can look at our spiritual lives the same way. There is spiritual dirt that we must deal with. 2 Peter 1:5-9 talks about this saying, "...make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness; and to godliness, mutual affection; and to mutual affection, love. For if you possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep you from being ineffective and unproductive in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. But whoever does not have them is nearsighted and blind, forgetting that THEY HAVE BEEN CLEANSED from their past sins." Notice, several of the characteristics listed in our spiritual lives are also needed when a person physically cleans: knowledge, self-control, perseverance.

Our physical surroundings don't get clean by accident. Neither do our spiritual selves. Instead, the dirt must be dealt with. It will take time, it will take work, it takes grace through faith, and it may get messy before it gets clean, but it is for the best. Paul prays for his Philippians readers in 1:10 that they may discern, "what is best and may be PURE AND BLAMELESS for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ-to the glory and praise of God." I pray that you will be a person that deals with the dirt.
