#### The Householder (Matthew 20:1-16)

# Laborers in the Kingdom

My first experience as a laborer was when dad offered to pay me \$1 a day to do the chores and pull up cockleburs in the pasture. I was in high heaven earning money, and it was a valued treasure to me. As I grew up, our neighbor asked me to be a laborer for him. He paid me \$10 a day, working from sunup to sundown. Boy was I ever rich, and I even helped dad with the morning chores before going to work. Eventually I earned \$1 per hour as a laborer which made those long days a little more acceptable.

Jesus teaches us about being **laborers in the kingdom** with his parable about the householder. *"For the kingdom of heaven is like a householder who went out early in the morning to hire laborers for his vineyard*" (Matt. 20:1-16). The householder agreed to pay the laborers a denarius a day to work in his vineyard. That would be about \$3.62 a day in today's value. Guess I didn't really know how good I had it making \$10 a day! But as the day went on, the householder hired other laborers to work for the same denarius a day. At the end of the day, the laborers who worked all day were not happy campers to find out those who only worked a few hours got the same pay as they did. I believe the message Jesus is teaching us in this parable is that he calls each of us to be **laborers in the kingdom**. Some of us will become laborers at an early age while others will enter kingdom work later in life. As Jesus' disciples, we have many different tasks to perform, some will be easy and some harder. No matter how long we have been in his spiritual kingdom and no matter what service or ministry we have performed, our reward will all be the same. Eternal life in that glorious kingdom of heaven. I pray that we will be filled with joy working together as **laborers in the kingdom** – the wages are AWESOME!
