Sermon: Life of Christ - "The Outsiders"

Intro: In the "social pyramid" those at the top are viewed as most important and valuable while those at the bottom have little to offer society. Jesus turned the social pyramid upside down.

A. Luke 7	7:36-50

- 1. Jesus anointed by a sinful woman
- 2. The woman was remorseful
- 3. The woman showed her great love
- B. Romans 12:3
 - 1. We should not think of ourselves more highly that we ought.
 - 2. We should think of ourselves with sober judgment.
- C. Humbleness
 - 1. Humbleness makes the social pyramid crumble.
 - 2. When people are humble, they don't think of people in categories.

Conclusion: Jesus' message to us is to see outsiders as God sees them, as sons and daughters that are lost but now found. The only entry requirement is to humble yourself and recognize your need for God's mercy.
