Sermon Scripture: Acts 25:23-26:32

Sermon Thought: How would you like to be the person these words were about, "I will show him how much he must suffer for my name?" Probably not so excited. But that is what God said about the apostle Paul. Next to Jesus, the apostle Paul is the most prominent person in the New Testament. The 2nd half of Acts is full of his life and he is credited with writing 13 books of the New Testament. Paul truly was a man whose life was "poured out" for Christ.

Song of Solomon 2:11-12 "For behold, the winter is past; the rain is over and gone. The flowers appear on the earth, the time of singing has come, and the voice of the turtledove is heard in our land."

This verse elegantly captures the essence of what is happening in our world right now. Outside conditions are idyllic. The mornings are cool and the afternoons are warm.
