Sermon Scripture: Galatians 5:1

Sermon Thought: As the early church spread, the gospel had to contend with all the supernatural beliefs of the time. One of the key teachings of the gospel is freedom in Christ. God's grace is a free gift, not one that can only be earned after a series of tasks or behaviors done just the right way. We must work to keep that freedom at the forefront of our lives so that we do not fall back into the trap and burdens of following rules rather than following God.

Sermon Questions:

- 1. Take some time and think of a few "unspoken" rules or rules from past generations about following God that are not necessarily found in the Bible by book, chapter, and verse.
- 2. Why does adding rules for following God come so naturally for people?
- 3. How can followers of God do a better job of seeking the freedom of Christ rather than the bondage of religion?

The Neglected Fruit

The next time you are walking through the produce section at the grocery store take a minute to look at the many assortments of fruit available. Of course, you have the common staples like apples, bananas, oranges, and pears. But there are many other types of fruit that you probably walk by without a second thought like dragon fruit, mangos, kiwi, or guava. Those are the neglected fruit. For whatever reason, most people don't buy them.

Last week I read through the fruits of the Spirit in Galatians 5:22, 23, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law." As I did, one of them jumped out to me as a neglected fruit of the Spirit...gentleness. I don't recall gentleness getting much attention other than times when there might be a Sunday school class or sermon series that spends a week on each fruit

When I looked up the definition of gentleness it said, "having or showing a mild, kind, or tender temperament," and it seems like our culture does not value characteristics like "tender," or "mild." They come across as weak and it should not be that way. One of the gentlest people I know stands 6'4" is about 300 lbs. and played defensive end at a major university. He will often catch people mid-air on the basketball court because he doesn't want them to get hurt. We could learn a lot from him. Strength and power in a way that seeks to take care of others.

As you go about your days, I want to encourage you to add the neglected Spirit's fruit of gentleness to your life. Treat others in ways that are kind rather than pushy, tactful rather than blunt, and wise rather than rash. Doing so allows you to shine God's light in this dark world.
