Forgiveness

(Matthew 18:21-35)

Forgiving Others

Forgiveness is another aspect of life that most of us struggle with. When we have been wronged or a loved one has been injured, our first reaction is to get back on them – to retaliate in some manner. Then there are times when we say we forgive someone, but we don't forget what they have done to us. That is why we often hear the expression "forgive and forget" when there is a need for true forgiveness. In spite of how difficult it is to forgive, there are still amazing stories of forgiveness. In these cases, it is only through the power of God that this wonderful deed of love, mercy and grace can be carried out. It is only in him that we have the courage and strength for **forgiving others**. The Lord tells us "For I will be merciful toward their iniquities, and I will remember their sins no more" (Heb. 8:12).

Jesus teaches us the eternal importance of **forgiving others** through his parable of the king who wished to settle accounts. He forgave a servant who owed him a large sum, and this servant then went out and demanded full payment of a small amount from one of his fellow servants. Not a good move! "And in anger his lord [the king] delivered him to the jailers, till he should pay all his debt. So also my heavenly Father will do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother from your heart" (Matt. 18:34-35). The Lord's prayer also teaches us "And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven others" (Matt. 6:12). Jesus goes on to tell his disciples, "For if you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father also will forgive you; but if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses" (Matt. 6:14-15). Do you get the point? **Forgiving others** is not an option! It is an essential element of our eternal salvation. Let us practice **forgiving others** from the heart.
