Finding a Purpose for 2020

In the midst of this unprecedented pandemic the world has been facing due to Covid 19 since March of this year, our world has been turned upside down. We started January 2020 so optimistically...this is the year the last two churches in capital cities would be planted in San Jose, Antique & Basco, Batanes, a work we have been doing since 1998. San Jose & Basco would have been #43 & #44! We were so excited to begin planning these last two church plants, great survey trips were done in Jan. & Feb. to start the ball rolling. This is the first year in our missionary services, where all our major works were fully funded for the year in advance. Such a burden lifted. In January & February, we received all the funds we needed for the two church plantings, Seyer Training Center, our orphans & college students, & extra funds to keep MOSES workers going in four churches, Mati, Tandag, Tarlac, & Siquijor. We were checking off happy boxes left & right. Fired up, ready to go for 2020. Praying & praising God for us to have the best year sharing the Gospel across the whole Philippines. Then we hit the middle of March...

I leave Negros on Thursday, March 12, everything is fine. I am heading to Ormoc, Leyte to speak Saturday, March 14, thru the help of Dr. Mark Landis to church members & leaders about counseling in the church. I get to Leyte Friday afternoon. We had been hearing about the Covid 19 virus, we had a few cases here & there in the Philippines. While traveling, President Duterte shuts down travel in & out of Luzon, closes schools & colleges. Soon all other governors are doing the same. I have to make a quick decision to turn around & go home to Negros or face the chance of being stuck on Leyte or Cebu island with no way to cross back to Negros to my family. We did a two-day trip, in one day, and made it on the last ferry boat crossing from Cebu to Negros at 11pm, on Saturday, March 14. I made it back to Dumaguete, where Becky & the kids were. We didn't know what was going to happen, it seemed like every day the government here put out different rules & regulations for us to follow. In a matter of days, we were in full house lockdown, having to have a pass for going out shopping at certain days & time. No traveling outside the city. Holding church services at home. Anyone under 21 or over 60 were not allowed outside their homes.

Now what? No church plantings...no way to travel to other islands. No classes for Seyer Training Center...all schools closed. No more MOSES classes or worshipping at church buildings...no gatherings bigger than ten people. Our big plans & dreams for 2020...puff...gone...put on hold.


We would have to find a new purpose in this topsy-turvy world, and it did not take long! The majority of Filipinos live hand to mouth, the money they make working that day, buys their food for the day. People on lockdown, having to stay in their homes, have no way to go to work, have no money to buy food. The government tried in the beginning to help by giving out some funds, some small amounts of rice, canned goods, & packs of ramen noodles. The average adult male here eats 1 kilo, or 2.2 pounds of rice or corn grits a day. Government help did not last very long. Thankfully brethren in the mountains have a little rice or corn grits stored up & grow some vegetables, but they have no access to meat. They need money to buy meat, which they didn't have. We had pigs we were growing for church plantings, classes, & special events. I was able to talk to the Barangay officials in Dumaguete and get a special minister's pass to be able to travel to different towns in our province, Negros Oriental, to visit church members, carry pigs to be butchered, and distribute free pork meat to our church members and those in need. New ministry work created...help feeding our hungry church members & others.

In April, we spent a week butchering 9 big pigs in different locations in the mountains where there was great need among church members, and down near our place by the sea in Ayungon. We lost count of all the kilos given away, but nothing was wasted, except the squeal! We helped several hundred families. I was thankful we had extra funds to hire brethren to help butcher & distribute the pork meat, and cover the cost of the pigs, so we can replace them for future needs. It felt so good to be able to go out, visit church members, check up on folks, help feed & encourage people. The brethren, widows, & orphans & others we helped were so happy! We have butchered more pigs in May and helped more brethren as well.

Now it is June, and we are still under lockdown. There is still a travel ban...all seaports & airports are shut down, no travel of people on or off the island. We still have Covid cases popping up. We have had over 21,000+ cases, and a little over 1,000 deaths. Government plans for travel, opening malls & restaurants, schools, & colleges are still unknown. It changes daily. It is hard to find purpose in these uncertain times. We may be limited in how we can serve & where we can travel to serve during this pandemic, but God will find a way for us all to keep shining His light into a hungering world. We might have to find new ways, it might be through a kilo of pork given away, a phone call to struggling preacher, or a quick visit to a members house, helping someone pay their bills, buying medicines for those in need. We might not be able to do all we planned to do in 2020 across the Philippines, but we can work to find ways to love our neighbors, family, & friends living close by for this season, of course with the proper social distancing involved! Grin!
