Bringing in Lost Souls

Have you ever been lost? I remember the horrifying feeling I had as a young boy when I lost sight of my parents in a department store. It was a very short time that I was lost, but it seemed like an eternity! Another time I got lost traveling from Illinois to Tennessee and ended up in Indiana. Again, not a good feeling, and we ended up missing the wedding we were going to. There is one thing we all have in common – it sure feels good to be found when we are lost.

Jesus' parable of the marriage feast testifies to the reality that we are all in a lost state and in desperate need to be found. He invites us to come to him for salvation, and he even sends out his servants to encourage us to respond. Jesus' mission on earth was **bringing in lost souls**, and he is urgent about accomplishing that goal. As Peter writes, "The Lord is not slow about his promise as some count slowness, but is forbearing toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance" (2 Pet. 3:9). Jesus has done his part in **bringing in lost souls**, and it's now our responsibility to hear his tender and loving voice and respond to him. As the Lord's servants, we have a mission for **bringing in lost souls** that Christ gave his life for. We need to be going out into our neighborhoods and communities to encourage the lost to give their lives to Christ so he can lift them up on the last day. Jesus tells us "For this is the will of my Father, that every one who sees the Son and believes in him should have eternal life; and I will raise him up at the last day" (Jn. 6:40). Praise God that we were lost, but now am found. "You were straying like sheep, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Guardian of your souls" (1 Pet. 2:25). **Bringing in lost souls** gives us a wonderful feeling for the joy of salvation!
