**Sermon Scripture:** Revelation 7:9; Revelation 2,3

**Sermon Thought:** From early in life, we are taught how to make good decisions. Unfortunately, the option not chosen is often deemed the "wrong" option or even "evil." Not all decisions are between good and evil. Sometimes the options are just different. Today's sermon looked at the vision John was given of every DIFFERENT nation, tribe, people and language standing before the throne giving praise to God.

**Sermon Questions:**

1. Why do you think people often view the options they don't choose as evil?
2. Why is it that despite the unity that should be found in God people insist on seeking division?
3. What differences between people do you tend to see first?
4. How can you do a better job of accepting differences rather than condemning differences?

Do I buy or sell? Should I turn left, or right? Blue paint or pink paint? We make decisions of all kinds every day and early in life we were taught how to make decisions. We should weigh the pros and cons. It helps to ask someone with experience. Doing research is beneficial. Hopefully, at the end of the process, we can make a good, thought-out decision. When all goes well, things turn out great!

Often though, there is an unfortunate assumption made after our decision-making process. That is, whichever decision we did not choose is viewed as wrong or even evil in many cases. Let's look at a few examples of how this works. Say "Susie" is deciding between two movies at the theater. One looks a little more unwholesome than the other and so Susie avoids it. After the movies end, Susie is shocked when a friend from church walks out of the "unwholesome" movie. The danger now is that Susie will think less of her friend, question her morals and maybe even question her faith altogether. Or take politics as an example. "Sam" chose not to vote for a certain candidate because of what he considers a moral issue. Sam later talks with someone who did vote for that candidate. Now, because Sam considers the candidate immoral, he considers the acquaintance immoral.

Obviously, some issues have a right is right and wrong is wrong, but...most don't. Most decisions are simply choosing between options that are **different**, and **different is not the same as wrong**. In Revelation, the writer John, includes comments to 7 **DIFFERENT** churches. Some are scolded, some are applauded, and some receive both. Later, Revelation 7:9 talks about a great multitude of, "EVERY nation, tribe, people and language," standing before the throne praising God. That is a lot of **difference** going on.

It is sad when people spend more time looking for differences to divide, than for similarities to unite. Paul hits the same point in Galatians 3:28, "There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ." If you were to think of a couple opposites to add into that verse for today's context what would they be? I hope you will pause today to reflect upon the unity found in Christ and remember that sometimes people's options, opinions and choices are **not wrong, just different**.
