A Dragnet Matthew 13:47-50 Catching Fish

I have fond memories of going fishing with my grandpa. Even though we had to crawl through a barbed wire fence, walk through tall grass and weeds, and put up with the pesky knats and bugs, I still had an enjoyable experience. We would get to the creek, bait our hooks, and throw our lines in and wait for the fish to bite. And wait I did but the fish didn't seem to be interested in what I had to offer. Then I would look over to where grandpa was and I saw that he was **catching fish**. What was he doing different? I soon realized that grandpa knew where to fish. He didn't just use any spot to put his line in, he used his years of fishing experience to select the right spot. So what did I do? I moved to where grandpa was and I began **catching fish** too.

Jesus invites us to go fishing with him just as my grandpa did. As he called his disciples, he told them "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men" (Matt. 4:19). He then spent time with them teaching them what all they were to do and I am sure it included how to go about catching fish of human souls. They watched how he did it and were well prepared when he sent them out on their own. Luke records that "the Lord appointed seventy others, and sent them on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to come" (Lk. 10:1). When they went about catching fish as Jesus taught them, they were "filled with joy" and excitedly shared with him "how even the demons were subject to them in his name" (Lk. 10:17). What a joy it indeed is when we share the gospel with sin sick souls and they respond to it. It gives them eternal life and constantly renews our faith and confidence in our ability for catching fish. Just as I learned from my grandpa how to do it, so we now learn from Jesus the joy of catching fish of human souls.
