Sowing Seed Mark 4:26-29 A Plentiful Harvest

When God created us from "the dust of the earth, and breathed into our nostrils the breath of life; we became a living being" (Gen. 2:7). That means our individual lives are the soil where he plants the seeds of spiritual gifts to carry out his divine plan. Paul explains the value of these gifts: "Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them" (Rom. 12:6). That is our task in life, to use the gifts God has given us to bring about **a plentiful harvest** in the Kingdom of Heaven. It is amazing to think about the spiritual seeds that are growing in our earthen vessels. We too don't know how they sprout and grow; they just do. Each day we wake up there is new growth, and it continues until we become the special vessels God has molded us to be (Rom. 9:19ff). That is how God brings about **a plentiful harvest** of human souls he planned. Jesus tells his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; pray therefore the Lord of harvest to send out laborers into his harvest" (Matt. 9:37).

This aspect of our spiritual lives is clearly illustrated in Jesus comparing "*The Kingdom of* God to the man scattering seed upon the ground" (Mk. 4:26). Just as we witness in our lives, "*The earth produces of itself, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. But when the grain is ripe, at once he puts in the sickle, because the harvest has come*" (Mr. 4:28-29). That means we can go forth in our daily lives with full confidence that God is working in us to bring about **a plentiful harvest** in the work he created us to do. I pray our lives will be filled with joy knowing that God has planted his divine seeds in our earthen bodies, and that he is anxiously waiting for our spiritual lives to become ripe so he can harvest us into his glorious presence. Praise God for **a plentiful harvest**!
