## **Called According to Our Ability**

When we begin our life's journey, how do we know what our abilities are? How do we know what kind of things we will be good at? In the beginning, we learn by doing. Someone shows us how, and we give it our best shot. But I wasn't as wise as my older brother. He taught me how to milk cows, then he quit. We may not be very good at first, but the more we work at it, the better we become. There are times in life that we may not know what our abilities are until someone tells us what they see in us and the things we do. Then as we mature, we are called according to our abilities to do special jobs.

The same principles apply to our spiritual lives. Jesus teaches that in the parable of the talents. When a man went on a journey, he invested in his servants according to their ability (Matt. 25:15). Each of three servants were given a different amount of talents. Two of them went to work using their talents and were able to double what they were given. When we put to work in the Kingdom of Heaven the abilities God has given us for our spiritual lives great things happen. Things begin to change – we make a difference in the world and people's lives around us. We have a testimony of this in Paul's missionary journey at Thessalonica. As Paul and Silas went about using their abilities to share the gospel, a multitude of lives were touched. Luke records that some of the Jews complained saying, "These men who have turned the world upside down have come here also" (Acts 17:6). That is good news, but sadly, when we don't use our God given abilities, we don't grow or accomplish anything for the Lord. We will then be cast out into "outer darkness" (Matt. 25:30). Therefore, brethren, never forget that we are called according to our abilities and the Lord will be with us in everything we do. He will be glorified!
