Sermon scripture: 1 Thessalonians 4.1-12

Sermon Thought: Too often people focus on big picture when thinking about a thriving life. Today's sermon considered the idea that by thriving in the small things we will thrive in the big as well. Consider what Paul challenged the Thessalonians to do: love each other, make moral decisions, work hard, mind their own business. Each of those require making small daily decisions.

Discussion Questions:

2. How do you see the small decisions leading to success in the big?

3. What do you think, "minding your own business," has to do with being a follower of God?

I also remember the lonely feeling I had when they left or we returned home. There was something missing! Our created need for **relationship** was broken, and we could feel it down to the depths of our souls. We have a very basic need for belonging to someone or a group. That is what gives our lives meaning and provides the motivation to do the things we are called on to do.

This internal need for **relationship** was given us when God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness" (Gen. 1:27).
