To Be Well Known

I have had many awkward interactions with people, as I am sure you have, when I either: A. I can't remember a person's name or B. don't even really know the person. I've had 10-minute-long conversations before with someone who obviously knows me, my family, what I do, but for whatever reason, I can't for the life of me place the person. Sometimes I end up asking someone, "Do you know who that was?" or it may come to me hours later.

On the other hand, there are times when I have not seen a person in years, but we could pick right up as though no time had passed. Those times leave me filled up, energized, and encouraged. I'm not sure all the reasons behind why some relationships are so easy or familiar but they can really make people feel as though they belong.

When Jesus walked the earth, he often taught about God's familiarity with and preparation for his followers. Consider the parable of the prodigal son in Luke 15:11-32. In it, one of a father's two sons asks for his inheritance and after receiving it goes and burns through it all. When he returns home downtrodden from his choices his father runs out to him, throws his arms around his son, and welcomes him home. The second is the parable of the talents of Matthew 25:14-30. In that parable, a master returns home after having been gone from some time and checks on the work his servants did while he was gone. He sings their praises as having done work well and being "good," and, "faithful." Finally, Jesus talked with his disciples saying, "In my father's house are many rooms...I am going to prepare a place for you," John 14:2. These teachings reveal that God knows his followers well. Not only that, but God has prepared a place for his followers to belong.

This world often seems full of strangers, conflict, the unknown and uncertainty. But just know, if you seek God and follow his ways, there is a place prepared for you. You will hear the words, "Well done, good and faithful servant." Here, but for a while we are as strangers in a foreign land, but there we will be well known.
