Teaching Our Children

Erik presented a powerful spiritual message last Sunday on holding to the Lord's teaching. God has set before us his commandments to regulate our lives and keep them in harmony with his will. He wants us to be able to walk with him in the spirit of holiness. We then can be all he created us to be.

I was so blessed growing up having a loving father and mother who taught me the enduring values of life. Their teaching began with being obedient, respectful, courteous, and caring for others. Granted, my learning was not always in sync with their teaching, so I had to learn a few things through their discipline. One of my frequently told stories is when I told my dad to "shut up!" and the consequences I suffered. Dad also taught me the value of hard and honest work, doing my best in everything I did. God understood the value of **teaching our children**, and he guided Moses to emphasize this divine aspect to the Israelites. Moses reminded the people of the law's twofold purpose: to bring them into a proper relationship with God, and to regulate their conduct toward orderly and beneficial living. As God told Moses, "Oh, that their hearts would be inclined to fear me and keep all my commands always, so that it might go well with them and their children forever" (Deut. 5:33). Each of us as parents want our children to do well in life, just as my parents did me. So, we must take to heart the words God gave Moses to encourage us in **teaching our children**. "And these words which I command you this day shall be upon your heart; and you shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise" (Deut. 6:6-7). When we do, we have the assurance that God will walk with them and bless them, and they will have success in life. Then they will also make a difference in the world. Lives will be touched, and souls will be saved. Then we will all be able to spend eternity with God. Let us remain obedient to **teaching our children!**
