## **Telling Your Story**

I was fortunate to grow up with several folks that were great story tellers. This always made the time pass quicker. Family get togethers were incredibly fun and interesting because you never knew which story one of your uncles was going to share. As I grew older and that older generation left us, I would cherish those stories of their life and the history that was passed down to the next generation. I am a good listener now because of them.

Everyone we meet at North Garland has a story to tell. They come to worship for many reasons: the convenience, teaching, great worship, to hear about Jesus, etc. I believe some also come for healing. Sometimes physical healing, but also spiritual healing. The ability to share their stories with a caring person can be a powerful tool for that healing.

Frederick Buechner once wrote in <u>Telling Secrets</u> that "God makes himself known to each of us more powerful and personally" (through stories.) If this is true, it means that to lose track of our stories or not have them heard, is to be profoundly impoverished not only humanly but also spiritually.

I suggest three simple ways to help us accomplish that goal.

1. See everyone today as important (including yourself)

2. Take time to really listen to the people in your life today. Hear what they say and what they don't say.

3. Remember that we (everyone is a member) are part of a team. You can't fix everything for everyone alone but working together we can be part of the solution and live life well together.

May God bless you as you share and heal through stories this week.
