Faith Through Conflict

Have you had events in your life that made you question God of why it happened? In October 2009, while at work, the left side of my body was paralyzed and blindness in my left eye. My ophthalmologist could not figure out why but sent me to a neurologist. On my first appointment two month later with the neurologist, he said, "You have a rare brain tumor that only affects 20 percent of the world's population. Last May, during the birth of my second son, I tore my left heart artery but did not know until six days later when I had a heart attack. I questioned God many times with many tears and deep anguish.

Jesus had many bad events where he could have questioned God, but he did not. Jesus endured horrific pain. He was beaten until his flesh hung in shreds. Soldiers mocked him, cursed him, and tortured him again. His wrists were tied to a crossbeam and he carried it to Golgotha. He laid on the ground, where soldiers nailed his hands, both ankles, and then he and the beam were mounted to the vertical post. He was trapped in this position, with constricting lungs, and struggling to breathe. He questioned God, Matthew 27:46 ...Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?" (which means "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"). After he died, his side was pierced. He eventually died through a combination of brain damage caused by lack of oxygen, heart failure, and suffocation, (https://www.jesus-story.net/crucifixion/).

I thought I was going to die during brain surgery. I was afraid of falling asleep for many months after the heart attack thinking I might die from another heart attack or another artery tear. I felt suffocation thinking I had no place on this earth anymore. Jesus had faith in His Father that he would be taken care of every step of the way. What better example can I ask to follow in His footsteps. I had to look to God for strength and guidance to keep my faith from wavering.


Teachers
