Few Burdens Are Heavy When Everyone Lifts Them

Being a servant means learning to put the interests of someone else ahead of your own. Serving others does not always come naturally for people. I think that a natural desire to serve can be witnessed in the kindness of a child. However, so can a natural desire to be selfish. That is why it's so imperative that we instill a desire for service in our children, and we cultivate that same desire for ourselves in adulthood. The problem is it can be so difficult to remain a servant. We let time, inconvenience, and lack of knowledge deter us, distract us, or convince us that we do enough.

Ask yourself "when is the last time I really inconvenienced myself in the service of someone else?" When is the last time you gave until it hurt? If something comes right to mind and you just happened to do those very things, that is wonderful! If you can't remember the last time you really served someone, maybe it's time to make it a forethought, not a matter of convenience. I myself have been guilty of forgetting to serve and I know how easy it can be, but serving others is one of the foundations of our relationship with God and our activity in His kingdom. We cannot leave these things to convenience. In John 13, Jesus washed his disciples' feet. How many of you would actually wash someone's feet if they asked you? I get it, feet are yucky and maybe that's "too far" for you, so I want to issue you a challenge. Find a possession in your home that you love. It can be a favorite shirt, a knickknackanything that you really enjoy. Take that item and give it away. Find someone who could use it or would want it. Someone who needs it and give it to them. Give until it hurts. We cannot put God first if our own interest occupies the top spot. Learn to serve. Love to serve. When we make someone's life easier or better, we make our own more worthwhile. Galatians 6:2 "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way, you will fulfill the law of Christ." Matthew 5:16 "In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."
