I'm sure you have noticed all over town the signs to pray for many different things. Praying is, of course, very biblical. We have so many examples in the Bible of people of God, such as David, Moses, and Paul, praying.

However, too many times today we don't take time to see the whole picture about prayer. Instead, we might be like Jonah and pray for God to change His mind and just "destroy those Ninevites." Sometimes we want to be like Gideon (Judges 6) and ask God to keep confirming the answer He gives us before we trust Him enough to do what He asks us to do.

Although there are many examples of prayer in the Bible, let's take a minute to think about Joshua. He was a man of prayer and prayed to God often to give him strength to guide the Israelites. Because of this, Joshua was very successful. However, do you remember what happened the one time Joshua forgot to pray for guidance? (Joshua 9) The Gibeonites tricked him into thinking they were from a far-away land, so without asking for God's guidance Joshua enslaved them instead of destroying them as God had told him to do to all of the nations around them.

Looking at Joshua as a prayerful leader is only half of his story. Just praying is not enough. His life shows us the need to get down on our knees and give God the glory, but also to be willing to get up and do what He wants us to do in His way.

Remember that we are Jesus's body: His eyes, mouth, feet, etc. In Hebrews 11, all of the faithful people listed are heralded for their "actions" of faith. Their lives show us the whole picture – listen for God's instructions, pray to Him to make sure we understand His will, and do all for His glory. It is our turn to show our faith in prayerful action for God. *Gene Denney*
