Study and Meditation

A Spiritual Doctorate

I have often thought about all the Bible classes and sermons I have been part of over my life. It is overwhelming to realize that we have been exposed to countless hours of biblical knowledge and spiritual nourishment. Then we add to that our own Bible study and preparation for classes we have taught, and we stand before God "complete, equipped for every good work" (2 Tim. 3:16). My assessment is that we have received a spiritual doctorate degree through all of our study and meditation. The question to us is, what have we done with all this knowledge and spiritual insight? Has it transformed us into the likeness of Christ? Are we using it to "let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven"? (Matt. 5:16). Having a spiritual doctorate means that we have the ability to make a difference in the lives of others and prepare them for their spiritual journey.

We are all valuable instruments in God's eternal plan for mankind. We are his hands and feet; his eyes and ears; his love and presence to carry out the work he's given us to do. That is why the apostle Paul encourages us to "Do our best to present yourself to God as one approved, a workman who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth" (2 Tim. 2:15). Our daily study and mediation continue to extend our knowledge and spiritual insight we have in a spiritual doctorate. It results in a wonderful blessing of being approved by God, and gives us confidence in handling the word of truth. We are powerful servants in the Lord's Kingdom. Paul writes, "The spiritual man judges all things, but is himself to be judged by no one. For who has known the mind of the Lord so as to instruct him? But we have the mind of Christ" (1 Cor. 2:15-16). Savor your spiritual doctorate!
