Sermon Scripture: Philippians 2:2; 4:2

Sermon Thought:

Too often Christians focus on differences and divisions rather than the ways that lead to unity. Sometimes this happens between churches, sometimes this happens in churches. At Philippi two sisters in Christ were in disagreement (Euodia and Syntyche). Paul pleaded with them to be of the "same mind."

Sermon questions:

1. In 4:2 Paul pleads with Euodia and Syntyche "to agree with each other in the Lord." What effects could their broken relationship have been causing in the rest of the church?

2. How can rejoicing help to defuse a stressful situation?

3. What stood out to you from today's sermon?
