Sermon Scripture: 1 Corinthians 16:13-14

Sermon Thought:

In the Bible, courage is also called "good cheer" as in Mark 6:50 when Jesus gave the command to the disciples who saw Him walking on the water of the Sea of Galilee and coming toward them. The Greek word translated "courage" and "good cheer" means literally, "boldness and confidence." In the Bible, courage is the opposite of fear. When God commands us to fear not, to be of good cheer, and to have courage, He is always commanding against fear, which is the opposite of courage.

Sermon Questions:

- 1. When in life do you find yourself needing courage?
- 2. What causes your courage to wane?
- 3. Why is living a life of courage and integrity so important?

Changing Lives

Rescue the Perishing

The process of changing lives is not easy. First, one has to recognize there is a need for change. Then there is the struggle in overcoming the bad things that have become a part of us. In the process of changing our lives, we often find ourselves slipping back into old ways. Praise God that we have family and friends that help us in overcoming our weaknesses. The powerful words of an old hymn give us confidence we can be successful in changing our lives when a loving servant of the Lord reaches out to rescue us. "Rescue the perishing, care for the dying, snatch them in pity from sin and the grave; weep o'er the erring one, lift up the fallen, tell them of Jesus the mighty to save." That is our task, that is our mission as God's people.

Luke tells us "For the Son of man came to seek and to save the lost" (Lk. 19:10). He came to rescue the perishing so they could live with him in the glory of the Father. Jesus calls us to follow him. He calls us to change from our life of sin by being buried with him in baptism and raised to a new spiritual life (Rom. 6:3-4). Our Lord and Savior now calls on us to rescue the perishing by sharing the gospel with them. Jesus tells us, "Unless you repent, you will all likewise perish" (Lk. 13:3). That was Peter's response to the Jews on the day of Pentecost: "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit" (Acts 2:38). Over three thousand lives were changed that day, and the process continues when we give our lives to rescue the perishing. We must be patient and gentle with lost souls to help them see their need for change, and then helping them overcome the struggles they will encounter. Always remember, "Jesus is merciful, Jesus will save." Praise God for loving servants!
