If anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come; the old has gone, the new is here!

2 Corinthians 5:17

I imagine we all have those people in our lives that we look up to. They are our heroes, and we aspire to be like them. God puts individuals in our lives to mentor us, to guide us, and to encourage us on our life's journey. One of my heroes was my Academic Advisor and math professor in college. One time I got the highest grade in his class on an exam, and boy was I ever proud of myself. Mr. Kooper was quick to set me straight when he told me everyone in class would have been proud of my grade, but that wasn't good enough for me. You see, I was a math major, and he expected more from me. That course correction put me on a path of much greater achievements than I ever dreamed possible.

I encourage you to take a journey through the Bible this year and look at the Heroes of Faith that God used to bring about the eternal redemption of mankind.
