Sermon Scripture: Matthew 24-25

Sermon Thought: The "end of time" or Jesus' 2nd coming has always evoked different emotions: excitement, concern, fear, intrigue. These two chapters serve as a reminder of how we ought to conduct ourselves. First, we need to be prepared by making sure that our own lives and selves are appropriate. Second, we ought not be alarmed. We should be confident of our position in God's kingdom knowing what awaits us. Finally, we shouldn't give in to the frenzy and worry that many people have.

Sermon Questions:

1. If Jesus will come when we do not expect him, why did he say we should look for signs that his return is near?

2. Why might Jesus have said, "Let the reader understand," or "he who has ears, let him hear,"?

3. What do you think a healthy response or preparation for the 2nd coming is?
