Spiritual Leadership

I was blessed in my formative years to be molded by God to be a servant in his Kingdom (Rom. 9:19-21). As I spent time earnestly talking to God in the "Ole Prayer Barn," I could feel his hands molding and shaping my life in a way that gave me courage to embrace the ventures of life that I would face. In a spiritual sense, I have crossed the Red Sea, delivered precious souls into the Promised Land, and rescued God's people from worldly captivity. As Paul writes, "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has passed away, behold, the new has come. All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation" (2 Cor. 5:17-19). I have been blessed to be able to continue my **spiritual leadership** as one of the Lord's shepherds, and as I make plans in my heart, the Lord is still determining my steps. May God bless you and keep you in his loving arms as we serve him together.
