#### Heros of Faith Esther

When we find ourselves in a position of embracing worlds unknown, what do we do? How do we respond? We are filled with anxiety as we step forward to embrace the challenge. One thing for sure, it takes a lot of faith to keep going. Esther stands as a **hero of faith** as she was confronted with an unexpected venue in her life. Although Esther was a Jew, she was among the beautiful women of Persia who were gathered as candidates to replace Queen Vashti. This was not a role in life she personally choose to do, so I am sure her anxiety and emotions were pretty high. The Lord was with her because she gained the favor of Hegai, who was in charge of the maidens. He took special care of her, making sure Esther had the best of the beauty care and training. Esther's beauty stood out from all the other maidens, and she was chosen to be the Queen by King Ahasuerus. Through all of this, she did not reveal her Jewish identity based on the instructions of her uncle Mordecai.

Esther's role as Queen took a difficult turn when Haman, the King's highest prince plotted to kill the Jews in the provinces. Mordecai learned of the plot and appealed to Esther for her help. What can our **hero of faith** do to avert Haman's plot when she is also part of the targeted people. Her uncle's encouragement reveals his faith in God's providence as well. *"And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?"* (Esther 4:14). Esther's faith again stands out as she decided to go to the king even *"though it was against the law; and if I perish, I perish"* (vs. 4:16). She found favor with the king and planned a feast with the king and Haman where his plot to destroy her people was revealed. The king rescinded his decree, and the Jewish people were saved because Esther had faith to embrace worlds unknown.
