Peeling Away "Cultural Christians"

In some parts of the US, in the southern and midwestern states particularly, Christianity has been an ingrained part of life. If a person wanted to be a respected business leader, a city or state official, association with a church was essential. These people were believers. They generally lived a good life. But Christianity was sometimes just skin deep. These church attenders have been designated as cultural Christians, People who went to church for reasons of politics, business, or acceptance. In other words, they wanted to be culturally accepted.

Today, the social pressures that kept these cultural Christians in church no longer exist. With the pressure off, cultural Christians are disengaging from their traditional churches. We see this reflected in the rate of attendance. In the 1990s, faithful, "committed Christian" attended church, on average, three times a week. Today, the typical "committed Christian" may attend religious services only once or twice a month.

The above excerpt from the book, <u>Empty Church</u>, identifies one of the changes in culture that churches and believers are navigating. As I read it, I was reminded of Paul's encouragement to Timothy in 2 Timothy 3:15 and believe it is a good reminder for us to remind faithful in these times, "But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it, and how from infancy you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus."
