Faith

1 John 5:4 for everyone born of God overcomes the world. This is the victory that has overcome the world, even our faith.

Faith means to have complete trust or confidence in someone or something. Faith is not something we are given, it's something we do. John 6:28-29 28 Then they asked him, "What must we do to do the works God requires?" 29 Jesus answered, "The work of God is this: to believe in the one he has sent." The first thing we need to do to be saved is to believe.

We have all the tools needed to obtain victory over sin and death. By accepting God's gifts and having faith in him, we vanquish all the hosts of night, in Jesus conquering name.
