Paul finishes his 3rd missionary journey by returning to Jerusalem where he knows imprisonment awaits. Despite that, he remains steadfast. Paul was arrested because people didn't like what he was saying and because they made assumptions about his actions.

2. What leads to a "cancel culture"? And why is it a tactic by people who disagree?
3. Paul used his rights as a Roman citizen to his advantage. When should we submit and suffer quietly? When should we insist on our rights and cause a stir?
