Prepare for Harvest

When we drive around rural Oklahoma this time of year, we notice many fields being prepared for wheat sowing. It's an exciting time for farmers.

After harvest each year, the farmers will work the fields to knock down the stalks of the harvested crop and loosen the ground to hold any rains that may come. All through the summer months they will continue to work the fields to kill weeds and work it deep to hold more rain. They will fertilize and plant the seeds to produce a good crop next spring. All through the growing process, they watch for bugs, and diseases that will harm the plant and they will take the action needed to protect it. This, caring for the crop, will not stop until it is ready to be harvested. If bad seed is planted, or good seed not taken care of, the crop will fail and not produce good grain. Bad grain could be no better than feed for the local pig or chicken farms.

In Hosea 10; 12, we are reminded, "Plant good seeds of righteousness, and you will harvest a crop of love. Plow up the hard ground of your hearts, for now is the time to seek the Lord, that He may come and shower righteousness upon you."

We must prepare ourselves, NOW, for the coming of the Lord. Never stop. His coming will be swift and sure. Are we ready? Or are we not preparing for the harvest?

Revelation 14; 15-16, Then another angel came from the temple and shouted, "Swing the sickle for the time of harvest has come, the crop on earth is ripe." So the one sitting on the cloud swung his sickle and the whole earth was harvested.
